Developments That Matter

[Australia's ESG Regulation Enters a New Phase](#)

Australia is moving into a period of mandatory, multi-layered ESG regulation, with AASB S2 climate-related financial disclosures beginning on 1 July 2026 for the second reporting cohort. Organisations will need climate governance, scenario analysis, emissions data, transition plans and targets, supported by expanding assurance requirements and ASIC guidance.



Why it matters: ESG in Australia is no longer voluntary - it is becoming embedded in law, with climate disclosure, environmental reform, emissions regulation, biodiversity management and social governance expectations reshaping compliance, project planning and strategic decision-making across the resources sector.

ESG Regulatory Developments

Australia Expands Commercial Solar Capacity



The Australian Government has moved to close a long-standing gap in the nation's clean-energy rollout, expanding the Small-scale Renewable Energy Scheme to include systems up to 1 megawatt. The update brings factories, farms and warehouses into the incentive framework that accelerated household solar, opening Australia's largely untapped commercial roofscape to meaningful generation.

Why it matters: This expansion strengthens Australia's shift toward implementation-driven sustainability, directing incentives toward real clean-energy infrastructure rather than small-scale ambition. Organisations that bring solar generation, storage planning and emerging digital optimisation tools into core strategy will improve energy resilience, reduce operating costs and be better positioned as Australia accelerates its clean-energy build-out.
